INTRODUCTION:

"HERMAN WHO?" (3)

I wish to continue the past two weeks theme with another submission regarding principles of Bible interpretation. Please do not let unfamiliar words deter you from trying to understand these most important principle; principle which we use every day (but might not have realized they had names).

The method or *science* of interpreting Scripture is called, *Hermeneutics*. The practical application of the principles of hermeneutics is called "exegesis", which literally means, "to lead out". Therefore, exegesis is the attempt to bring out the meaning intended by the original author.

Be assured, God expected us to be able to understand His word, and we can understand it (Eph. 5:17). It is not for merely a select group of "clergy" or a special "priesthood" to read, interpret, and teach it to the masses. "It is both the right and the obligation of every person to determine the meaning of the inspired text".

Also, the Scriptures were meant to have a very distinct meaning conveying to us a most specific message for the most part; therefore, none of us has the right to a *this-is-what-the-Bible-means-to-me-* approach. We may not merely seek from a passage what is personally satisfying to me, we must interpret it according to God's intention!

The first rule of Bible interpretation is "context"; we must always consider the context. How does this verse relate the biblical book in which it is found? This is best done by refreshing our minds of the pertinent information within the book (which is best accomplished by reading the entire book or, one can also consult a good Bible introduction).

Next, determine who is speaking (or writing). Remember, the entire Bible is an inspired record but, nevertheless, contains writing and statements from uninspired men. For example; Isaiah 37:10-13 contains a letter from a pagan king who severely blasphemes Jehovah God.

It is also vital to know to whom the passage is addressed. Is every command in the Bible something we need to obey? If so, how is your ark coming along (cf. Gen. 6:14)? Or, are we all to be waiting in Jerusalem until we are clothed with power from on high (cf. Luke 24:49)?

These few suggestions, if heeded, would greatly diminish much of the confusion today.—JK.
