GOD'S MERCY MANIFESTED

Romans 3:23-26

INTRODUCTION:

1. The mercy of God is a beautiful theme in Scripture, but the need for God's mercy arises from an unsavory truth: all men are doomed to death because of sin.
2. Man is incapable of ridding himself of sin and the only suitable sacrifice would be a perfect man, and that Man was Jesus (Heb. 4:15): He is the *propitiation* (covering, mercy seat (Heb. 9:5) for our sins (25).
3. God was not obligated to save us, that is why it is called "mercy": it was not required—it was granted, or *graced* to us: **Grace**: the *attitude* of God toward sinners; **Mercy**: the *action* of God on behalf of sinners; **Faith**: the *appropriate response* of man to God.

I. GOD'S MERCY IS TO THE PENITENT.

- A. God's Mercy is Available to All (Titus 2:11; John 1:12).
- B. God's Mercy Has Requirements (always has).
 1. Old Covenant: (Isa. 55:7; Jer. 3:12).
 2. New Covenant (Tit. 3:4-5):
 - a. God's mercy saved them when they received the "washing of regeneration"—baptism (Jn. 3:3-5; Rom. 6:1-8).
 - b. Paul said he obtained mercy in his salvation to serve as an example to others who believe on the Lord to everlasting life (cf. 1 Tim. 1:16).

II. GOD'S MERCY IS TO THE PRAYERFUL.

- A. The Example of David (Psa. 51:1-4, 10-12).
- B. The Publican (Lk. 18:13).
- C. The Sorcerer (Acts 8:21-23).
- D. Cornelius (Acts 10-11).

III. GOD'S MERCY IS PATIENT.

- A. Nehemiah (Neh. 9:17; 30-31).
- B. Paul to the Roman Christians (Rom. 9:22-24).
- C. Peter shared the fact of God's patient mercy (2 Pet. 3:9, 15).

IV. GOD'S MERCY WILL BE PRESENT AT THE JUDGEMENT.

- A. As Jesus Taught (Mt. 6:14-15).
- B. As James Taught (Jas. 1:13).
- C. There is no unrighteousness with God (Rom. 9:15; cf. Exo. 33:19).
 1. Mercy and compassion are not arbitrary.
 2. Upon whom, then, will God have mercy? The obedient-faithful ones.

CONCLUSION:

1. God's mercy is a result of His grace, and it was manifested to us in the person and work of Jesus Christ.
2. God's mercy is manifested to
 - A. those willing to repent
 - B. the prayerful
3. God's mercy is patient and will be present at the Judgment.
4. Man can be a recipient of God's marvelous mercy only by accepting it on His terms

SOMEBODY WILL HEAR AND BELIEVE!

“One of the women Harvey Weinstein was convicted of sexually assaulting said Tuesday that the verdict made her feel grateful to be ‘heard and believed’” (apnews.com). There have been untold numbers of women (and likely men too) whose cries for justice along this particular line have gone unheard and unbelieved.

I suspect that one of the things lending itself to the cries of some going unheard and unbelieved, and that is generally compounding the problem is that there are some who are not really victims, but are simply jumping on the “me too” train, and this is unfortunately, making it harder for the ones who have suffered genuinely.

I can only imagine the myriad of emotions Miss Haley and others have felt when in similar situations, but her comments resonated with me in a slightly different way and in a context different than the atrocities conducted by the criminal, Weinstein.

Our Lord Jesus, although wholly divine, was also wholly human. That means he could experience the feeling of betrayal which is among the worst feelings you and I can experience. Our Lord is an eternal resident of Heaven, and because of our sins, He agreed with the Father to forfeit that abode for a time, come to earth, and go to the cross as a sacrifice so that His pure, innocent blood could take on the guilt our sins (Phlp. 2:5-8), thus freeing us from the eternal punishment of the second death (Matt. 25:46; Rev. 20:14).

I know that Jesus was betrayed by Judas (Matt. 26:14f.), and by Peter (Matt. 26:69ff), but He must also have felt nearly the same thing when He taught and preached, and His words went unheard and unbelieved. Compound the personal feelings of betrayal with the love that Jesus has for mankind and knowing the fate which awaited them if they would not heed His words, and Jesus—from an earthly viewpoint—had every right to feel sad, discouraged, and later, even victimized.

Perhaps you have felt as though your words were going unheard and unbelieved when you tried to talk to someone about Christ. Scoffers have always been around, and I suspect always will be. The good news is that there are still honest sincere seekers of truth in the world and we must continue to spread the eternal word of the Savior of mankind. Someone **WILL** hear and believe; we just need to keep getting the word out there. Don’t be discouraged! Don’t give up! Don’t pass on an opportunity to save a soul—*JK*.
