BARNABAS

INTRODUCTION: Acts 11:22-26

- 1. Jerusalem church *sent* (*apostled*) Barnabas to Antioch, perhaps hoping to reconcile efforts by the 1st Jew/Gentile congregation of the Lord's church.
- 2. Barnabas was the right man in right place at right time.

DISCUSSION:

I. BARNABAS WAS A GOOD MAN (24).

- A. "Good", intrinsically good, good in nature (cf. Mt. 25:21).
- B. Showed his goodness to Paul (Acts 9:26-27)

II. BARNABAS WAS A LIBERAL MAN (Acts 4:36-37).

- A. Apostles named him, "Son of consolation" or "encouragement/ comfort". Contrasted with greedy Ananias and Saphira (Acts 5:1f).
- B. Voluntarily (not socialism! —4:34-35; 5:4) gave proceeds of a land sale to the apostles to distribute to poor in Jerusalem church.
- C. Christian giving has always been sacrificial in nature (2 Cor. 8:5).

III. BARNABAS WAS AN EXHORTER (23).

- A. "Exhorted" them all with resolute, predetermined purpose of heart that they ought to be clinging unto the Lord for dear life.
- B. A mighty supporter for the cause of Christ. (Acts 2:47).

IV. BARNABAS WAS NOT ENVIOUS (23).

- A. The church at Antioch was growing; Barnabas was sent to see the success and when he saw it, he was glad!
- B. Envy is ugly! (Pro. 14:30; Acts 7:9; Mt. 27:18).

V. BARNABAS WAS FULL OF THE HOLY SPIRIT (24).

- A. Guided by Holy Spirit (Acts 13:1) as a prophet/teacher.
- B. Holy Spirit would guide chosen ones into all truth (Jn. 16:13).

VI. BARNABAS WAS FULL OF FAITH (24).

- A. Stephen also full of faith and the Holy Ghost (Acts 6:4).
- B. Had good grasp of the doctrine of Jesus Christ; believed it! Lived it! Willing to die for it!

VII. BARNABAS WAS SUCCESSFUL (24, 26).

- A. Barnabas had a name for encouraging people (24, cf. Acts 2:41).
- B. In conjunction with Paul, he taught even more and as a result, the name "Christian" was given to the ones he and Paul taught (26).

CONCLUSION: He made an impact on the ones to whom he preached and taught; he altered the course of eternity; we can too if we will try to be like Barnabas

REAL SACRIFICE Roger Rush

The apostle Paul wrote: "I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service" (Romans 12:1). Do you know what it means to make a sacrifice? Perhaps the following will be helpful.

Charles Eastman, a full-blood Santee Sioux, was a renowned author and lecturer during the first four decades of the last century. Eastman wrote much regarding Indian life and religion. According to him, an integral part of the ritual of passage in which an Indian boy became a man was the first offering. This offering required the child to sacrifice to the Great Mystery the thing he held most dear. Such sacrifice was designed to instill in the child an appreciation for the needs of others. Eastman wrote of his own sacrifice. At the age of four he made what must have been one of the most difficult decisions of his life. He sacrificed his most cherished possession, his dog.

Sacrifice, if it is genuine sacrifice, requires the offering of something of worth or value by the one making the sacrifice. King David said that he could not offer unto the Lord that which cost him nothing (2 Samuel 24:24). No sacrifice is involved if there is no giving up of something cherished and valuable. Too many Christians want to follow Christ without real sacrifice. Religion is a fine thing if it doesn't require much, but a religion without sacrifice will not save.

God made two demands of Christians regarding sacrifice. First, we must offer our bodies to him. We must give ourselves in His service. Second, ours is a living sacrifice. It does not require the physical death of the victim, but it requires the consecration of the life to the work of Christ. The old man of sin is destroyed, and we become new creatures in Christ (2 Corinthians 5:17).

Have you discovered the real meaning of sacrifice? Have you consecrated yourself to the service of God?
