WALKING WITHOUT GOD

INTRODUCTION: (Reading Amos 3:1-3)

- 1. The prophet Amos declares:
 - A. The "whole family" (Amos 3:1) which God had chosen and redeemed from Egypt had sinned repeatedly.
 - B. Because of His relationship to His children -the whole family-God could not allow their conduct to go uncorrected.
- 2. God would punish them for their iniquities (3:2).
 - A. They had not walked together with Him
 - B. To walk with God should be our desire.
 - C. To accept His laws for His glory and our good.
 - D. To "walk in the light" (1 Jno. 1:7).
- 3. We cannot "walk out" with God and continue to reject His will for us.
 - A. To walk with God, We must agree with Him regarding certain facts.
 - B. There are at least four:

I. AGREEMENT AS TO PLACE AND TIME.

- A. Place-The foot of the cross, where Jesus shed His precious blood (Col. 1:20; Mt. 26:28).
- B. Time-Today (Heb. 3:7-8; 2 Cor. 6:2).

II. AGREEMENT AS TO GOAL.

- A. To glorify God (Gal. 1:10; Mt. 5:16; 1 Cor. 6:20; 1 Pet. 2:12; 4:16).
- B. To gain Heaven (Mt. 24:13; Jn. 10:9; Rom. 10:1; 1 Tim. 2:3-4).

III. AGREEMENT AS TO PACE.

- A. We must keep step with the master.
 - 1. Cannot "walk disorderly" (2 Thes. 3:6-11)
 - 2. Jonah of old attempted this (Chs. 1-2).
- B. Many desire for God to keep pace with them—that's backwards.

IV. AGREEMENT AS TO COST.

- A. What did it cost God.
 - 1. It cost Him His Son (Jn. 3:16; Rom. 5:8; Mt. 27:46)
- B. What did it cost Jesus?
 - 1. Glory (Phil. 2:6-7).
 - 2. Time (Jn. 9:4).
 - 3. Blood (1 Pet. 1:18-19).
- C. What will it cost us?
 - 1. Money (Lk. 14:28)
 - 2. Time (Mt. 8:22).
 - 3. Everything (Rom. 12:1).

CONCLUSION:

- 1. Is such a life possible?
 - A. Ask Enoch (Gen. 5:24)
 - B. Ask Noah (Gen 6:9)
 - C. Ask John (2 Jno. 4; 3 Jno. 4)
- 2. It is my prayer that with a willing heart, we will ready our minds to agree to walk together with God.

A CALL TO WORSHIP Roger Rush

Worship was an important part of first century Christianity. The Lord's Day (Sunday) was a special time of remembrance and celebration. Christians came together to partake of the Lord's Supper as a memorial to the broken body and shed blood of Christ the Lord (1 Corinthians 11:23-29; Acts 20:7). They worshipped a living Lord, not a dead Savior. Jesus had resurrected, and there was cause for celebration. In the words of Luke, historian of the early church: "They continued steadfastly in the apostles' doctrine and fellowship, and in the breaking of bread, and in prayers" (Acts 2:42).

Not everyone understood the importance of their weekly gatherings or the benefits to be derived from them. The writer of the Hebrews epistle urged his readers to be faithful in this matter. He admonished: "Let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith, having our hearts sprinkled from an evil conscience, and our bodies washed with pure water. Let us hold fast the profession of our faith without wavering; (for he is faithful that promised;) and let us consider one another to provoke unto love and good works: not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as the manner of some is; but exhorting one another: and so much the more, as ye see the day approaching" (Hebrews 10:22-25).

I frequently talk to people who express a strong distaste for "going to church." They claim to be as religious as the next guy but have little use for boring religious services. Personal experience, as well as Scripture, has taught me that worship is neither boring nor useless. I have never left a service without gaining something of benefit. We need the fellowship, encouragement, and instruction that the worship setting provides. It is a grave mistake to forsake the assembly of the saints.

Please consider what the Scriptures say regarding worship and commit yourself to being present and participating. I promise you that if you do you will not leave disappointed.
