#### THE EYES OF JESUS

John 2:23-25

**INTRODUCTION**: We are not speaking of the physical characteristics of Jesus but rather, how our Lord saw things.

#### I. JESUS HAD PENETRATING EYES.

#### LEFT BEHIND (AGAIN)?

A new *Left Behind* movie has been released. It's a remake of the 2014 release, which was an adaptation of the popular *Left Behind* series of books authored by Tim LaHaye and Jerry B. Jenkins.

In the blink of an eye, the biblical Rapture strikes the world. Millions of people disappear in an instant as terror and chaos spread around the world and darkness enfolds the planet. Airline pilot Ray Steele is in the air at that moment and struggles to save the lives of the passengers that remain on his flight, as the world below loses its ability to help his plane to safety... As to why we don't embrace the rapture theory is simple; it just ain't so. The rapture fallacy is embraced by Premillennialists who teach that when the end of time comes, Christ will return to the earth, set upon David's throne in Jerusalem, and then reign for a literal one thousand years—the Bible nowhere teaches this!

The "Left Behinders" assume the entirety of Matthew 24 deals with the Second Coming of Jesus Christ. However, when we look at the response that Jesus makes, it becomes clear that He is discussing two (separate) events.

In Matthew 24, Jesus told His disciples, regarding the Temple, "There shall not be left here one stone upon another, that shall not be thrown down" (2). The disciples ask Jesus, "When shall these things be? and what shall be the sign of thy coming, and of the end of the world" (3)? In the minds of the disciples, they asked but one question; yet Jesus gave two answers. In verses 4-35, Jesus answers the question regarding the destruction of the temple and Jerusalem. In verses 36-44, he responds to their question regarding the end of the world. Our failure to make this distinction will cloud our understanding surrounding "end-time" events.

In the first section (vss. 4-35), Jesus references, "those days" (vss. 19, 22, and 29) and gives indicators as to when the destruction of Jerusalem will take place. Then in verse 36, He changes the plural "days", to the singular, "day"; "But of that day...". The word, "But", is a conjunction of distinction, and that, coupled with the change of number with reference to days/ day, indicates a distinction between the events of which Christ is speaking. What is more, is that He says definitely that there will be NO SIGNS for His return (36, 42; Mark 13:32-33).

Those holding to this premillennial position appeal to Matthew 24:40-41 for proof of the imaginary rapture as well. "Then shall two be in the field; the one shall be taken, and the other left. Two women shall be grinding at the mill; the one shall be taken, and the other left." When it is understood that the Greek word for "taken" means, "received; and the word for "left" means, "sent away", then the meaning of the verse becomes clearer and there is absolutely no reference to some kind of rapture. When Jesus returns to judge the world according to His Word (John 12:48), some will be "received" into Heaven; and some (the majority-Matt. 7:13-14) will be "sent away" into everlasting punishment (Matt. 25:46)—
