THE CHALLENGES OF A GOSPEL MEETING

It is great to be with you this week in the Gospel Meeting. The almost fourteen years we were with the Tenth and Clairmont congregation were very special to us. We look back on them fondly and treasure the friendships that we made. We are looking forward to renewing our fellowship this week.

Gospel Meetings are a great way to spread the word of God in a community and I am looking forward to doing so this week. I know you have been planning and preparing for this effort, and we certainly know God will bless our work. Like anything we choose to do of great importance also poses some great challenges, and how we meet those will determine the success of our work. Unquestionably the power is in the Word of God, but it is up to us to spread that word to those who need to hear it. Surely this deserves our very best effort. As Solomon said, "Whatsoever your hand finds to do, do it with thy might." (Ecclesiastes 9:10) Might" is from a word that means "strength, vigor" as opposed to "weak, half-hearted." Let us not be half-hearted in supporting and working for this Gospel Meeting effort. Make no mistake about it, this will be a challenging week.

This Gospel Meeting will challenge us to examine our priorities and see if we really are putting first things first. So, what are your plans for this week?

This week will be a wonderful opportunity to expose your friends and neighbors to the powerful message of a loving God. We just have to make up our minds to put God first this week.
