A New Perspective on Life

Dale Carnegie observed: “One of the most tragic things I know about human nature is that all of us tend to put off living. We are all dreaming of some magical rose garden over the horizon instead of enjoying the roses that are blooming outside our windows today.”

Someone else has written: “Today is the day I have been looking for. All my life has been spent in preparation for it. Yesterday and tomorrow are faraway nothings – one a faint memory, the other a vague promise. But this is my day. It offers all that God has to give, and I’m a laggard or a coward if I fail to make the most of it.” If we spend all our time regretting the past or daydreaming about the future, we will miss out on the present. With our past forgiven and our future secure, the present takes on far greater meaning. Jesus came to give us an abundant life (John 10:10). As a Christian we can face each new day with confidence.

With a smile on our face and a song in our heart, life truly is an adventure. Each day brings new joys, rewards, opportunities, and challenges. Life really is worth living.

However, if we remove Christ from the picture there is no hope and no forgiveness. In that case the past will haunt us, and the future will frighten us. But in Christ we can exclaim with the Psalmist: “This is the day that the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it” (Psalm 118:24 ESV). Is He your Lord and Savior? If not, why not?
