MEMORIAL DAY

Monday will be formerly observed as a legal holiday in this country designed to honor our war dead. The freedom and prosperity we enjoy were acquired, and have been maintained, at tremendous cost - the blood of thousands and thousands of patriots - husbands, fathers, sons and daughters. Those of us who enjoy the benefits of freedom should take time to honor the memory of those who made the ultimate sacrifice for this nation. Jesus once observed, "Greater love hath no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends" (John 15:13). Many a man has answered the call of his nation because of his love for family, friends, and county.

They deserve our admiration, respect, and thanks! It seems appropriate, given the fact that our nation will pause this weekend to pay tribute to our war dead, that we who are Christians should be reminded of our weekly Memorial Day!

About 3500 years ago the people of God were slaves in Egypt. Moses and Aaron were pleading for their release when God worked His final miracle upon the land - the death of the first born. That night the faithful Israelites killed the "Passover lamb." They roasted and ate it, applying the blood of the lamb to the door posts and lintels of their homes. The first born in every home where the blood had been applied lived, but all others died. The Passover Feast served thereafter as a memorial (a monument) to the night Israel secured her freedom.

It was at the observance of the Passover memorial that an even greater monument was erected to the Lamb of God! On the night Jesus was betrayed He met with his disciples, and during that meeting instituted the Lord's Supper. Through the unleavened bread and grape juice, we are forever reminded of the broken body and shed blood of our redeemer. He asked that no other monument be erected to His memory. He sought no ornate cathedral or marble likeness. He asked only that His memory be kept alive through the simple act of communion around His table each Lord's Day.

As great as our debt to our war dead may be, we are greater debtors to the one who died at Calvary to provide for our freedom from sin and its condemnation. We should not let a Sunday pass without remembering His sacrifice around His table. Will you be among the faithful who assemble around the Lord's table this Lord's Day, and every Lord's Day, to remember Christ and His sacrifice on the cross?
