- I. The world has many opinions about Jesus.
 - A. The people did not deny that Jesus was remarkable.
 - a. Matthew 16:13-14
 - b. The answers they gave were respectful ones, honorable ones, and religious ones.
 - B. It is possible to admire Jesus and still not know him.
 - a. John 1:10-11
 - b. Imagine that, the creator came into his own creation and people still misidentified him.

- II. Jesus demands a personal confession.

- A. After asking the crowd, Jesus made it personal:
 - a. Matthew 16:15
 - b. It does not matter what your parents, spouse, children, elders, and friends say.
- B. Simon Peter answered:
 - a. Matthew 16:16
 - b. Peter confessed two foundational truths:
 - i. Jesus is the Christ.
 - ii. Jesus is the Son of the living God.
 - c. John 20:30-31

- A. After Peter's confession, Jesus said:

- a. Matthew 16:17
- b. Human Philosophy, public opinion, and religious tradition cannot save us.
- B. It changes how we view salvation.
 - a. John 14:6
 - b. Acts 4:12
 - c. That means Jesus is not one option among many.
- C. It changes how we view obedience.
 - a. Matthew 28:18
 - b. To confess Christ while resisting his authority is contradiction.
- D. It changes how we view the church.
 - a. The Church belongs to Christ.
 - b. It is built on truth.
- E. It changes how we view eternity.
 - a. John 8:24
 - b. If Jesus is who he claimed to be, then rejecting him is fatal.
