Why We Can Trust the Bible

In a world filled with confusion, changing opinions, and broken promises, it is comforting to know that God has given us something we can fully trust: His word. The Bible is not merely a human book. It is the inspired word of God. Paul wrote, "All Scripture is God-breathed and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, for training in righteousness" (2 Timothy 3:16).

We can trust the Bible because of its divine source. Holy men "were moved by the Holy Spirit" as they spoke from God (2 Peter 1:20–21). Though written by many men over many centuries, the Bible speaks with one united message. Its harmony, truthfulness, fulfilled prophecy, and power to change lives all point to its heavenly origin.

We can also trust the Bible because God's word is true and enduring. Psalm 119:160 says, "The sum of Your word is truth." Jesus declared, "Your word is truth" (John 17:17). Human ideas fail, but God's word stands forever (Isaiah 40:8).

According to the teaching emphasized in the Church of Christ, the Bible is our final authority in matters of faith and practice. We do not follow human creeds, traditions, or opinions above Scripture. Instead, we seek to speak where the Bible speaks and remain silent where the Bible is silent. Because we can trust the Bible, we should read it, obey it, and build our lives upon it. God's word will never mislead us. It will guide us safely to Him.

 - B. Paul later wrote in 2 Timothy 4:2:
 - a. 2 Timothy 4:2
 - b. The Lord's church must be a teaching church.
