When the Heat Is On

Daniel 3 records one of the most powerful examples of faith under pressure. Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego were commanded to bow before Nebuchadnezzar's image. The furnace was hot, the crowd was watching, and the king was threatening. Yet their answer was clear: "Our God whom we serve can deliver us... But even if He does not... we are not going to serve your gods" (Daniel 3:17-18).

There will be times when the heat is on for God's people today. The pressure may come from temptation, family, friends, work, culture, or fear. The question is not whether pressure will come, but whether our faith will stand when it does. These three Hebrew men remind us that true faith does not depend on comfort. They trusted God's power, but they also submitted to God's will. Their faith was not, "We will serve God if He makes life easy." Their faith was, "We will serve God no matter what happens."

Christians must have that same conviction. Jesus said, "If you love Me, you will keep My commandments" (John 14:15). Faithfulness means obeying God even when it costs us something. We must not bow to false doctrine, sinful living, or worldly pressure. When the heat is on, remember this: God sees, God knows, and God is with His faithful people. The same God who was present in the

furnace is with His people today. Let us stand firm, obey His word,
and trust Him completely.
