Supporting One Another in the Lord's Work

The apostle Paul reminds us that "the body is not one member, but many" (1 Corinthians 12:14). Within the local church, no single person can do all the work that needs to be done—and God never intended it that way. Teaching classes, leading singing, serving at the Lord's table, visiting the sick, maintaining the building, preparing meals for the grieving, and countless other tasks all require willing hands. But willing hands need encouraged hearts.

Too often, those who labor faithfully in the church do so quietly, and just as quietly wonder whether anyone notices. A teacher prepares a lesson week after week. A song leader studies new hymns. An elder or deacon carries burdens few ever see. Paul writes, "whether one member suffers, all the members suffer with it; or one member is honored, all the members rejoice with it" (1 Corinthians 12:26). We are called not merely to observe one another's labor, but to share in it—through prayer, through a word of thanks, and through simply showing up to help.

Solomon wrote, "Two are better than one... for if they fall, one will lift up his companion" (Ecclesiastes 4:9-10). The church's work was never meant to rest on one person's shoulders. When we say, "Let me help," instead of, "Let me watch," we ease another's burden and strengthen the entire congregation. Paul likewise urges us to "bear one another's burdens and so fulfill the law of Christ" (Galatians 6:2).

The writer of Hebrews gives us a clear charge: "let us consider one another in order to stir up love and good works... exhorting one another" (Hebrews 10:24-25). Encouragement is not optional in the Lord's church—it is part of how we obey Him. A brief note of appreciation, an offer to substitute in a class, a hand with setup or cleanup, or simply telling a fellow Christian "I see your effort, and I'm grateful for it" can renew a weary servant's strength.

As we consider the work before us, let each of us ask: Who around me is serving faithfully, and how can I support them? The church grows strong not because a few carry everything, but because many carry something—together, for the glory of God.

Teaching the Next Generation

- I. God commands deliberate, repeated teaching.
 - A. The shema – teaching woven into daily life.
 - a. Deuteronomy 6:6-7
 - b. Teaching is not confined to a classroom or a single hour on Sunday.
 - B. The warning against forgetting.
 - a. Deuteronomy 4:9
 - b. Note the scope: not just children, but grandchildren.
 - C. Built into worship itself.
 - a. Exodus 12:26-27
 - b. God designed worship and memorial with built-in-teaching moments.

Notes:

- II. Faith is taught through living example, not information alone.
 - A. A Godly heritage in the home.
 - a. 2 Timothy 1:5

- b. Two generations of women modeled and taught faith before Timothy ever preached a sermon.
- B. Knowing from whom you learned it.
 - a. 2 Timothy 3:14-15
 - b. Paul ties Timothy's confidence in scripture to trusted people who taught him – teaching is relational, not merely informational.
- C. The congregation as a teaching family.
 - a. Titus 2:1-8
 - b. This is the New Testament pattern for the local church.

Notes:

III. The Church's charge: Multiply faithful teachers.

- A. Four generations in one verse.
 - a. 2 Timothy 2:2
 - b. Paul > Timothy > Faithful men > others.
- B. Telling the coming generation.
 - a. Psalm 78:4-7

- b. Notice the stated purpose: not mere historical knowledge but hope in God and obedience to His commandments.
- C. The father's charge.
 - a. Ephesians 6:4
 - b. Personal bible study at home, faithful attendance and participation in bible classes, elders and teachers equipping the saints, congregational involvement in vacation bible school and youth devotionals.

IV. The warning remains real.

- a. Judges 2:10
- b. Joel 1:3
- c. Psalm 145:4
- d. The choice remains what it was in Joshua's day.
- e. Joshua 24:15
